## SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES MARCH 12, 2019

Members of the Board of School Trustees met in executive session at 5:30 p.m. on this date at the Central Office pursuant to Indiana's Open Meetings Law for the purpose of discussion of strategy with respect to any of the following: Initiation of litigation or litigation that is either pending or has been threatened specifically in writing and any individual over whom the governing body has jurisdiction: to discuss, before a determination, the individual's status as an employee, a student, or an independent contractor. No topics were discussed other than those listed on the public meeting notice. All members were present.

President Juergens called the Project Hearing to Order at 7:02 p.m.

Mr. Nauman stated the purpose of the hearing and presented the project plan, estimated costs, and the project timelines. Mr. Harpe invited public testimony and allowed time for questions. There were none.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS & REPORTS**

## **SUPERINTENDENT COMMENTS:**

Mrs. Eppley and Ms. Wallace introduced the FFA Parliamentary Procedure team. They placed 6<sup>th</sup> at the state contest.

Mr. Bush reported that 9 area teams participated in Math Bowl at Redding Elementary on February 21, 2019. Emerson placed 1<sup>st</sup> and Cortland placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Red division. In the Orange division, Redding placed 1<sup>st</sup>, Jackson 2<sup>nd</sup>, and Brown 3<sup>rd</sup>. He thanked the team for their hard work putting on a successful event.

Mr. Harpe introduced the Elementary Cup. The competition will use Olympic style scoring in Match Bowl, Spell Bowl, Robotics, iReady usage and the 5<sup>th</sup> grade track meet. After four events, Redding sits at the top of the leaderboard. The current focus is on 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students, but the hope is to open up other areas to get the lower grades involved as well. The Cup will be presented to the winning school in May.
